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

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CENTER FOR MIDWIFERY

As a leader in high-risk obstetrics, the Women's Institute has long been a destination birth center for moms-to-be. However, many women seek a more natural, home-like birth experience under the guidance of a midwife. The institute's Center for Midwifery enables women to receive birthing services from certified nurse-midwives with the peace of mind that comes from having other medical experts and technologies nearby if intervention is needed. The Center for Midwifery blends the high-tech benefits of a hospital birth center with the high-touch experience that comes with a midwife delivery.

CRITICAL CARE OBSTETRICS

Among the programs that differentiate the Women's Institute is critical care obstetrics, a division of maternal-fetal medicine. For decades, the institute has served as a model of care coordination and clinical expertise for women whose pregnancies are considered high-risk.

VIRTUAL OB INTENSIVE CARE

When a pregnant woman becomes critically ill, immediate access to the highest quality care and round-the-clock monitoring from clinicians trained in maternal-fetal health is paramount. The virtual intensive care unit for obstetrics (OB) at the Women's Institute provides real-time bedside care to critically ill pregnant patients and their unborn babies, regardless of hospital unit location.

EARLY INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION

In women's health, preventative medicine begins in adolescence and continues through menopause and beyond to ensure long-term health and wellness. The Women's Institute subscribes to the philosophy that regardless of a woman's age or phase in life, early intervention and prevention strategies are vital to maintaining and improving health.
